Glory be to the Son,


Who by His Precious Blood delivered me from hell,



Message from Father Rodrigo:

At the very heart of our Christian belief is our profession of faith in the Holy Trinity - the community of Father, Son and Spirit. This is the core, the foundation, the center of our creed. We believe it, we profess it, we proclaim it, we live it. The Father is wholly united with the Son and the Son is completely one with the Father in their bond of love, which animates their oneness in the person of the Holy Spirit. The Three becomes one, a mystery in our faith that has been profoundly reflected since the foundation of Christianity.



It is to this unity that our community at Saint Mark, Saint Mary and Holy Trinity is called. It is Trinitarian, a unity that is inseparable. Let us humbly reflect on this theme of unity this Sunday, on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. Like Mary, who was chosen and called to share in the intimacy of the Trinitarian unity, may we also open up to the grace of God so that like her we may become a vessel worthy of the divine life we received in baptism.

The Father has willed that we become His children, the Son has willed that we give birth to Him in our daily life, the Spirit willed that we become His partners in bringing forth the love and compassion of God in the world around us. Let us pray that we may live in the Trinity faithfully until eternity.

Symbols of the Trinity: Equilateral Triangle; Circle of Eternity; Three interwoven Circles; Triangle in Circle; Circle within Triangle; Interwoven Circle and Triangle; Two Triangles interwoven in shape of Star of David; Two Triangles in shape of Star of David interwoven with Circle; Trefoil; Trefoil and Triangle; Trefoil with points; Triquetra; Triquetra and circle; Shield of the Holy Trinity; Three Fishes linked together in shape of a triangle; Cross and Triangle overlapping; Fleur de Lys; St. Patrick's Shamrock.



WAYS TO HONOR THE MOST HOLY TRINITY

The simplest way to honor the Most Holy Trinity is to begin every day by making the Sign of the Cross with deep faith and devotion, paying special attention to the words that we say: "In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen!" Then worship the Triune God in your heart by reciting the prayer "Glory Be . . ." and the Creed, through which we renew our faith in the one God in three Persons from whom we come, in whom we live, and in whom we will find our eternal happiness.

Then thank the Blessed Trinity for all the graces and favors received so far; ask for His protection during the day, and offer Him all the actions that you will perform and the pains that you will endure. In this way, all that you are and do will be consecrated as a "living sacrifice of love" to the God who is our Creator, Redeemer, Sanctifier and Source of our happiness.

These prayers can be repeated during the day, especially the shorter ones as simple acts of love and worship. The Sign of the Cross should be made also before every important action that we do, such as when we begin our daily activity, before and after taking our meals, when we travel, when we feel tempted or in danger.

Every day should end in the same way we should begin it. Our final thought should be an act of entrustment of ourselves and all those who are dear to us to the Most Holy Trinity. In addition to honoring the Holy Trinity through our prayers, we should also make every effort to become in our daily lives a reflection of

the "personal loving communion" which the Blessed Trinity is. We do that by relating with respect, openness, and love to all human beings, and especially the members of our family, colleagues and other people we interact with. It is only by respecting and loving our neighbor that we can say that we respect and love the Blessed Trinity, for He dwells in each human being. Consequently, as St. John the Evangelist says, "One who has no love for the brother he has seen cannot love the God he has not seen" (1 Jn 4:20).
